Spring 2024 Honor Flight by the Numbers

The 2024 travel season kicked off with a triumphant BANG in May! 104 of our community's heroes and 42 of their dedicated escorts were treated to the trip of a lifetime by our team of 44 volunteers/medical staff/media members, touring our nation's capital for 2.5 days.

While in Washington, DC,

Veterans visited the National Museum of the US Army, World War II Memorial, US Marine Corps War Memorial, the National Archives, US Navy Memorial and Museum, Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial, Military Women's Memorial, the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier within Arlington National Cemetery, US Air Force Memorial, Lincoln Memorial, Korean War Veterans Memorial, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, and finally, Fort McHenry ... whew! We're still catching our breath after that wonderful whirlwind!

Along the way, 60 wheel-chairs were loaded onto and then off of and then back onto the buses 28 times.

1,720 meals were served over the course of the three days and countless bottles of water were passed out.

Extra gear in the way of

blankets, rain ponchos, changes of clothes, candy, snacks, chocolate chip cookies, paperwork, medical supplies, and recording equipment was handled several times per day.

Schoolchildren and caring adults would stop our Veterans while touring to express their thoughtful gratitude and show their support. Active duty military we encountered along the way paid their respects in the most reverent and stoic ways they allowed. Everywhere we traveled we met ardent supporters.

Hearts and old wounds were healed and new bonds were formed ... and that's something none of us will ever forget!

The Spring 2024 trip for Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN will again go down as an incredible opportunity shared by the most worthy folks our area is lucky to call their own.

Get to Know One of Our Flight Veterans

In the early weeks of 1967, Colin "Coby" Barstad knew Uncle Sam would be calling him soon. He had an early draft number and was certain that if he waited for his call-up he'd likely find himself in harm's way regularly.

Rather than being drafted into the Army, he decided to

take control of his fate. He had decided to drive to Minot, North Dakota to speak with the US Air Force recruiter to enlist. However, when he got there, he found a note on their door letting him know that no one was in the office at that time. Without missing a beat, (cont'd on next page)

(cont'd from page 1) he went across the hall and enlisted in the US Navy instead!

Shortly thereafter he was on his way to training for the next chapter in his life's story.

After meeting and making many lifelong friends in the early days of his time in the Navy (one of which would later stand up at his wedding as his Best Man), Coby was headed across the Pacific en route to Vietnam.

A Radioman aboard an LST (tank landing ship), Coby was responsible for sending and receiving communications to and from their watercraft. Regularly, they'd haul supplies to and from Da Nang to

either Chu Lai or Cua Viet. Periodically, a supply run to Okinawa would also take

place.

While overseas, Coby says they were within close range of mortar fire while the battleship USS New Jersey provided cover assistance, all of which was rather unsettling. Anoth-

er time, their LST rescued a downed Marine fighter jet pilot and pulled him out of the water. That experience was both rattling and thrilling at the same time.

On his final trans-Pacific sailing, Coby's time in the Navy was up. He caught a flight from Guam back to California to begin his discharge.

Throughout the reintegration process, Coby and his comrades were instructed on what had been transpiring stateside since the last time they were home. For their own safety, all military members were told to

wear civilian clothes and not display anything identifying them as members of the armed

forces, should they choose to fly home out of the San Francisco Airport. Doing so was for their own safety as there were many protestors posted up there, and their messaging was in no way supportive of the work they'd done.

Coby was confused ... he hadn't done anything wrong or committed any

crimes. Why were his fellow countrymen turning their backs on him and his comrades? That confusion led to anger and hurt. This wasn't how it was supposed to be. Nonetheless, he followed their orders and went home in plain clothes.

For the next 50+ years, Coby would wrestle with the anger he felt over his return. When Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN opened applications to Vietnam Veterans, he applied, thinking the trip sounded like fun. What he couldn't have expected was the healing that would come with his experience.

Upon landing at the airport in Baltimore, MD, a crowd of travelers had stopped to cheer and welcome our heroes to town. All those years later, Coby and his comrades were finally being welcomed home.

After a whirlwind tour of our nation's capital, the welcome home reception at the airport in Fargo was even more incredible!

The therapeutic side effects of our Honor Flight trips are unmatched, especially for our Vietnam Veterans. We are so very grateful people like Coby have placed their trust in us and that their expectations have been wildly exceeded.

Valley — the place he's called home his entire civilian life.

For many years after the military he worked for the Hornbacher's company as a Produce Specialist and now spends some time with Corwin Toyota.

In 2015, David began volunteering for Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN and soon thereafter moved onto the Board of Directors. Numbers have always been his thing and minding the bank accounts has been a perfect fit for his strengths.

He says, "As a Vietnam Veteran, I consider all of our Veterans my family. It is an honor to take them to Washington, DC to and tour the Memorials dedicated to their service, plus the many other sights we visit."

Know Before You Go — Luggage Requirements



Duffle bags gifted to each Veteran. Medical devices need not fit inside.

Each of our flying Veterans is gifted a beautiful, spacious duffle bag (courtesy of American Legion Post 21 in Moorhead) to pack their personal effects in for their trip. The bags are color coded by bus assignments and have luggage tags meant to be personalized. It's critical that each of our Veterans uses these specific bags for our flight.

Because of the extensive amount of gear we shuttle to Washington, DC, we are very limited on space for luggage and can not accommodate checked or roller-style bags.

Additionally, there are times when our Veterans' luggage will be in the capable hands of our trained volunteers and need to be moved swiftly.

Knowing which bus a particular piece of baggage belongs on at a glance is crucial.


As you're gearing up for your trip, please remember that packing your things in your Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN duffle bag is required.

Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN has taken a leap into the technological future! In May, we shifted the pool of paper applications to an online format and away from handwritten copies. Doing so will not only save physical space (there are almost 900 applications

already in the stack, just waiting for their call-up!), it will also streamline our processes, eliminate potential challenges, and keep data secure.

Along with this shift, some of the information we've previously needed (advanced health care directive, Living Will) are no longer required.

All applicants will be able to edit their information online with ease in the case of a move, new medical diagnosis, or otherwise.

We understand change can be hard ... this is one that's very exciting, however! And best yet, all previous paper applications have already been captured.

Awhile back we decided to utilize providers from the Fargo VA Health Care System. The relationship between VA providers and our most precious cargo (our Veterans) is a key advantage to ensuring the safest experience possible.

Each flight is staffed with doctors, mental health providers, and respiratory therapists. In the case of a special diagnosis, we implement appropriate personnel assignments. Our team analyzes each Veteran's health conditions and is prepared to care for each.

Just like in your military days, our medics can be recognized by their special uniforms — red shirts and first aid backpacks.

adult language nor must they remain celibate.
