to make over 500 Veterans' trip of a lifetime happen.



Elizabeth "Beth" Olson of Moorhead. MN served in the Signal Corps of the US Army, eventually achieving the rank of E-4

Growing up an "Army Brat" in a family of eight children, Beth Olson (nee Person) and her siblings bounced all over the country. Ultimately, the Persons settled in Detroit Lakes, Minnesota after her father's Army retirement. In 1972, Beth graduated high school and decid-

ed to give college a go in the Twin Cities. Her journey would lead her back to the tech college in Detroit Lakes and trying hard to find some stability in her young adulthood.

(cont'd from page 1) enlisting in the Army ... so off they went to meet with their recruiter! Except ... her friend backed out and Beth was off on her next big SOLO adventure.

Fort McClellan, Alabama was Beth's first stop in the military. Her basic training class was all women, as every unit to pass through the gates were then. And while she would be mandated to learn many of the things a male soldier would — physical fitness, tactical experiences, survival

skills, and so on — she and the rest of her group were never allowed to fire any weapons while in training.

That would change in January 1974 when she landed in Korea with the Signal Corps. As luck would have it, Beth's previous college experience proved she was excellent with office work ... which bought her a seat in the Commander's office as his clerk. She was one of the first women in the role and did her job well enough to keep her in that assignment for a year. She filled the same role for another 1.5 years at Fort Huachuca, Arizona.

Of her experience she says, "my male peers never had a problem with my gender. To them, I was simply another soldier putting in the work. I did find things were made unusually harder for women or it was believed that we couldn't do things, simply because of our gender."

In 1976, her time with the Army was over and she moved to the Red River Valley, where she's been since.

A lot of unfair assumptions were made of Beth and her connection to the military — she's "just" a spouse, she had to have been "just" a nurse, or worse, that women didn't belong in the military. Such sentiments caused her to step away from any real Veteran-type events until her friend and Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN Volunteer, Barb Chamberlain, convinced her she qualified for a trip.

On her September 2024 trip,

she was given a huge surprise — being honored at the Women's Military Memorial while the other 100 male Veterans watched. It was a moment she won't soon forget.

#### Meet a Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN Volunteer

Patriotism courses through the veins of the entire Ishaug family and Susie, the youngest of three sisters, is no exception.

As a fresh-faced 18-year-old, Susie enlisted in the North Dakota Air National Guard, following in her father's and sister's footsteps. After several assignments and job titles, she retired from the NDANG in 2021 as a Senior Master Sergeant and the Cyber Systems Superintendent at the Communications Flight. She continued her civilian work with the Air Guard until 2023.

After her father, DeLyle Ishaug, made his Honor Flight in 2015, Susie began volunteering for our outfit managing the ever-growing master list of applicants. Before

long, she began her time on the Board of Directors.

The flight her father took opened her eyes to the needs of the WWII and Korean War era veterans — old battle scars softened and camaraderie was shared amongst strangers. She knew she had to be part of this outstanding cause.

A 1982 graduate of Moorhead High School, Susie has enjoyed working with the thousands of deserving Veterans on each of the more than one-dozen flights she's made (only missing one while she was deployed to Kuwait in the fall of 2017). Being local to the Fargo-Moorhead area has meant she knows many of the flight Veterans personally and

has so enjoyed showing her appreciation for their sacrifices and services.

Susie is the proud mother of a beautiful daughter, Gracie, who carried on the family tradition and joined the Happy Hooligans in 2022.

In addition to her work with Veterans Honor Flight of ND/ MN, Susie is also a member of American Legion Post 21 in Moorhead and is a life member of AMVETS in Fargo. If

#### Real IDs required for May 2025 Honor Flights and beyond

Anyone who wishes to travel via commercial or chartered airline beginning May 7, 2025 will need to possess a Real ID.

Real IDs can be obtained at your local Driver and Vehicle Services in Minnesota and Driver License offices in North Dakota. You will be required to bring several documents to your appointment to obtain your Real ID. Be sure to reference the website listed here to determine what information you will need to gather beforehand.

Not sure if you already have a Real ID? Check to



see if there is a star on your ID card. If there's NOT a star, your card won't be valid for air travel later this spring.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to apply for your Real ID now. The process can take some time and we never know what could potentially impact the processing turnaround time.


